Enter Walter K. So-called "prism" sharpeners, also called "manual" or "pocket" sharpeners in the United States, have no separate moving parts and are typically the smallest and cheapest commonly used pencil sharpener on the market. While most linear blade sharpeners are simple and directly hand operated, some devices in the past were crank operated, using mechanisms to convert crank rotation into linear motion.
