A fully effective system of disclosure would ensure that, a the name of the sponsor of an advertisement appears clearly within the ad and that, b basic information about the sponsors of election advertisements is publicly available. Enforce existing FCC rules on disclaimers and adopt stronger requirements for the display of sponsor information within all political advertisements. The ideas we have come up with in some cases are new and in some cases support approaches currently being advocated.

We believe these regulations would have an excellent chance of surviving court challenge. To avoid constitutional problems created by such a vague standard, the Court limited the reach of the law.
